Physical Restraint – Supporting Student Wellbeing

We are committed to creating a safe, nurturing, and supportive learning environment for all our tamariki. In line with the Education and Training Act 2020, and the guidance of Aramai He Tētēkura, we focus on recognising and responding to student distress in respectful and compassionate ways.

As a school, we work hard to minimise the use of physical restraint and prioritise wellbeing through de-escalation strategies, proactive support, and strong relationships. We are also committed to upholding Te Tiriti o Waitangi and ensuring equitable outcomes for all our students.

We're pleased to share that all teaching and authorised support staff at St Joseph's have completed the mandatory online module on understanding and applying the physical restraint guidelines required Ministry of Education training.

We want to assure you that we follow all legal and ethical guidelines around physical restraint, and our approach is always one of care, respect, and support. Seclusion and unsafe restraint practices are not used at our school under any circumstances.
