### Advent at Our Kura – Preparing Our Hearts for Jesus

As we prepare for the season of Advent, our kura enters a special time of hope, waiting, and preparation for the coming of Jesus at Christmas. Advent invites us to slow down, reflect, and notice the light of Christ growing in our world—just like the candles on the Advent wreath.

Our tamariki will explore the meaning of each Advent candle: **Hope, Peace, Joy, and Love**. Through Scripture stories, prayer, music, and creative activities, they'll learn how these Gospel
